for the eighth bar.

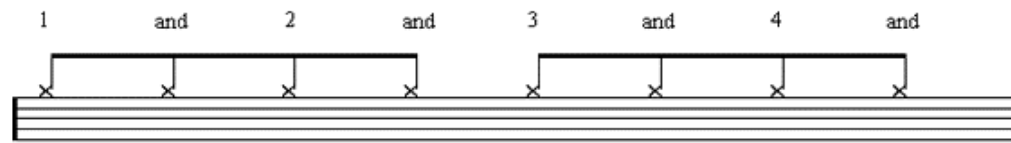
Repeat these eight bars four times, then perhaps give

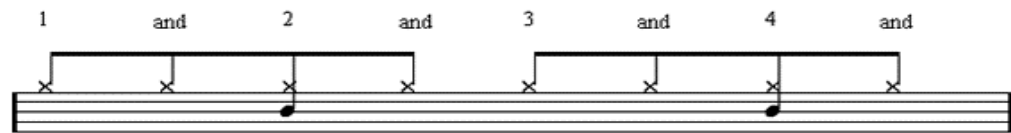
First steps. Closed Hi=hat only (Right hand.)

This is a barre meaning a finger holds down more than one string. (Often all six as in B)



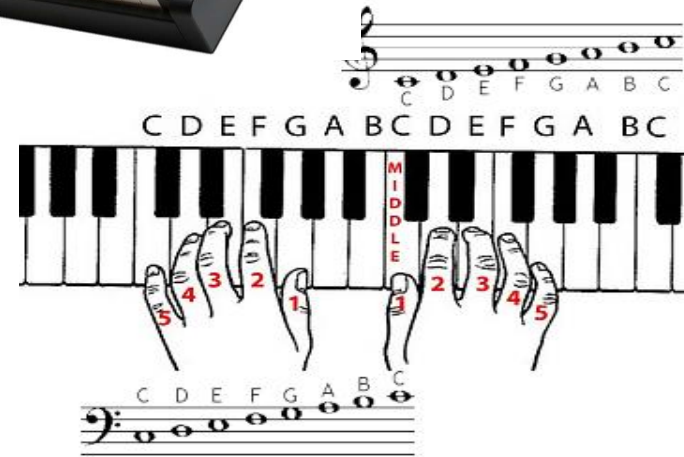

KEYBOARD OR PIANO

A full sized keyboard has 88 notes. The black notes (sharps or flats) are arranged in groups of two, then three. The white note immediately before the pair of two blacks is called C. If it is in the middle of the keyboard, it is "middle c". Tunes are made from scales, which start off with C then the next 7 notes, D,E,F,G,A,B then the next higher C. From C to the next C is called an Octave, no Octopus, ah no..Octave. Yes that is it.

One person could play both hands at once, or one play the treble clef (right hand) and another play the bass clef (left hand). Another could play chords on ukulele or guitar.

Minims are 2 beats long
Crotchets are 1 beat long

They include i-pads, Android tablets and windows laptops and pcs.

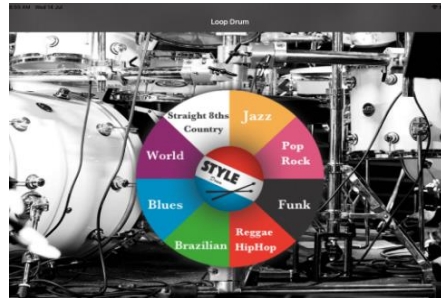
Each type of device has several apps that you can use to improve your instrumental skills, and assist in your composition and performance challenge.

Loop Drum. (Hundreds of drum beat backing tracks.)

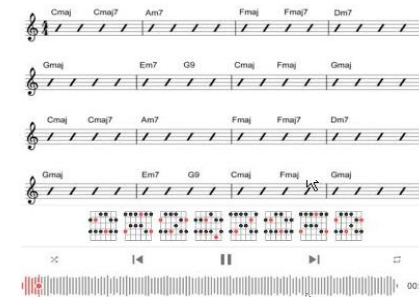

A Quick Intro to some of the Apps

PaintMusic

Choose instruments. Record. Use your finger to make notes of various lengths and pitches. Rewind and overlay other instruments.

Paint Music & Paint Vintage

Choose a theme and some instruments. Paint and erase with your finger. Export to Notes to save.

Session Band

Experiment with some of the Demo sounds to start with.

Odesi

Choose Keys and Instruments.

Ratatap Drums

Record yourself playing the drumkit with your fingers.

Loop Drums

Choose a style and a beat. Play along.

Real Piano

Play and record a tune.

n-Track Pro

A little multi track recording studio. Check out the user guide and video tutorial.

Chord Bot

Chord sequencer. Try the Song-O-Matic option and the Help Manual.

Simple Music

East to create tunes using keyboard sounds, Guitar sounds and others.

Ukulele Chords

Find and play uke chords.

Voice Manager

Record voices or instruments to replay.

Jam Box

Choose "skip" as you log in. Then choose a backing track.

Your own notes about apps you have used: Device type, number, file names saved.
